Bazaar

The bazaar is held at St. Mary's from 9am to 3pm on the Saturday before Thanksgiving. The next bazaar will be Saturday, November 22, 2025. Mark your calendar!

This is one of the few old-fashioned church bazaars in Anchorage. There are no vendors. All goods are handmade by parishioners and friends. The handmade goods fill up Waldron Hall. In Cay's Room, we have the Registables, which are donated new or lightly-used items, for sale at great prices.

At the Souper Cafe, you can buy soup and cornbread, sit and relax for a few minutes before getting back to shopping. Youth at the Jesus Java coffee cart help to keep shoppers and workers energized.

Funds Raised

The funds raised from the bazaar are donated to various organizations. Each year, the bazaar team determines which organizations to support. Workshops

Most months we have workshops on the second and fourth Saturdays, generally in Waldron Hall. A couple are scheduled for Classroom 2 downstairs. Most are from 10 am to 2 pm. Periodically we have special workshops that go from 9:30 am to 3 pm. Then as the bazaar date approaches, we have more frequent activities to get everything ready. Many people bring their own project to work on during the workshops. Others work on a common project. We'll definitely put you to work! We have a sewing machine that is available to use during the workshops, so if you have a sewing project, no need to lug your machine to church.

Some of the workshops have a specific focus, where we learn something new, or where many of the participants work on something special, such as salsa, jam, and bean soup mix.

At each workshop, we take a break and enjoy a potluck lunch together.

If you can't master the scissors, we have other things you can help with. It's all about community building."

Workshop participants are very welcome to bring children. We enjoy the energy and noise that comes with having kids around. No childcare is provided, but we can team up to help watch the kids, allowing the parents to have a couple of free hands for a bit.
