When it wouldn't fit in the overhead bin, she carried it on her lap all the way to Hawai'i.

But when they got to Maui, the toilet seat turned out to be the wrong shape for the toilet at the vacation house. So Tay, unwilling to let a perfectly good toilet seat go to waste, carried it all the way *back* to Anchorage on their return flight – presumably *still* on her lap. Goodness knows what the other passengers on the flight made of the situation.

So now the Thomases were home, with a nice, never-used, and extremely well-traveled toilet seat that they couldn't use in Hawai'i and had no use for in Anchorage. What to do with it?

Well, back in the 1980s, St. Mary's used to hold an annual garage sale fundraiser. So Tay decided to donate the toilet seat to the garage sale. Her mistake was in telling the sale organizers *why* she was donating a toilet seat, of all things. As soon as the story came out, the seat was grabbed. It had too good a tale to simply be sold. It needed a higher purpose. It would be auctioned off at the Annual Meeting!

And so it came to pass that a toilet seat was put up for auction at the Annual Meeting, to benefit various projects and causes. But the story does not end there; for in the general hilarity of bidding on a humble bathroom accessory the congregation decided that the toilet seat should be made a permanent auction item, with each year's winning bidder's name to be mounted upon the "throne", and the throne itself mounted in a place of honor at St. Mary's...the wall by the bathrooms, of course.
